Field Trips: We are looking closely at starting field trips again along with how to make sure they are safe for all members. The following will be highly recommended as well as making sure members are aware of any local regulations. We're all missing our great Club Field Trips so PSoA member Jamie Shelton has kindly provided us with a report of her own Virtual Field Trip.

Hunting From Home: Fossil Matrix in your Mailbox!

Hello Fossil friends! Fortunately, fossil hunting tends to lend itself to social distancing, but some of us are being extra cautious (and rightly so!) and are curtailing even our solo fossiling trips. But I found a way around all that....hunting from home! Some friends from a little home grown company of PaleoTex LLC posted that they sell bags of Matrix from a variety of locations – Texas, Oklahoma and elsewhere. I decided to buy a few pounds to see what I could find. And I have to say... I found LOTS!

I got two Permian fossil matrices – Texas Red Beds and Oklahoma from Richard Spur, plus a little bit of West Texas Cretaceous Aguja formation. Now, some of these are TINY fossils, so if you are patient and have a good magnifying lens (or handheld microscope camera – I got one recently and LOVE IT), you will find all kinds of little tiny treasures! I found quite a bit of great stuff with just my reading glasses and good lighting (yep, I'm creeping up on 50 and need those glasses!) but I went through it again with my microscope camera and found even MORE great stuff!

So if you are interested in getting some matrix for yourself, PaleoTex LLC is on Facebook, you can message them and they will happily send you some in the mail! (They sell it by the pound for \$13 but also have some specials on larger amounts). Happy Hunting!
